**Kris Michaelson:** We've been talking with President Foster from Colorado Mesa University. Today July 14, 2020, we wanted to ask you some questions about the COVID-19 pandemic in Mesa County. How did it impact you personally, and how did it impact Colorado Mesa University, and how are you getting the message through that CMU starts out next week. Did you get that memo about COVID-19? How did it feel?
